NSS PO Ms Swati conducted a quick survey of students to understand the social media behaviour by students.


The findings of the survey were discussed in this workshop. Ms. Sheetal Bidkar also commented about the findings of this survey during her comments.

Participants came to know about treatment of violence and inequality to which young girls are subjected to even in today's world. During the event speakers spoke about menstruation cycle and the kind of care and hygiene required to be taken for a healthy body. After screening the documentaries faculty brought out few distinctive characteristics of Odisha and few similarities between the state of Maharashtra and Odisha were brought to the attention of the students.

These are enlisted as follows:

Similarities between Maharashtra and Odisha

- 1. Paddy or rice is a very important part of the agricultural output produced by both the states.
- 2. Odisha and Maharashtra have been bestowed with a shared ecological diversity of the Mangroves forest.
- 3. Visit of the migratory birds, Flamingos is common between the coast of Odisha as well as the Chilika lakes regions of Odisha and the Mumbai, Thane and Raigad coastal regions of Maharashtra.
- 4. In spite Maharashtra being a relatively developed state than Odisha, both the states share the presence of the big four varieties of mosquitos which cause Malaria, Fileria and Encephalitis fevers.

Unique characteristics of the state of Odisha

- 1. Pipli handicrafts, the Odisha version of applique work with it's typical design for wallhanggings, handbags, and other household items.
- 2. Cane furniture
- 3. The architecture Marvel of the Sun Temples of Konark, Dist. Puri
- 4. Distinction of Bhubaneshwar, the state capital of Odisha being the Temple City of India. After the discussion program was concluded with a note to arrange few more activities during next 3-4 months.

Blood Sugar Check-up camp, in association with Rotary Club of Bombay Queen City, December 4, 5, 6, 2019 "Project Positive Health Camp"

Date: December 4, 5, 6, 2019

Timing : 8.30 am to 3.30 pm

This blood sugar check-up camp is open for all students, their parents, teaching, non-teaching staff. Random blood sugar test shall be performed by technicians for every participant. Anyone who's random sugar level is greater than or equal to 160 in the preliminary report, their blood samples will be taken to perform the Hab1c Test to monitor sugar levels during past 60 days.

If the Hab1c test is performed, such a person shall get the report via a link sent through SMS to the mobile number mentioned in the registration form.

Inauguration of Blood Sugar Check up Camp in Association with the Rotary Club of Bombay Queen City. Inaugurated by Rotarian and President Mr. Girish Agarwal.

Details of number of persons checked, included college students and their parents / family members, staff, members of community around college and regular visitors in college such as post office staff

Day 1 272 persons Day 2 218 persons Day 3 118 persons Total 608 persons benefitted from the blood sugar check-up camp.

4 persons were found to be diabetic, (3 women and 1 male). The 3 women were knowing that they are diabetic. The male member (24 years) discovered today that he has high sugar. His sugar was 224. He is one of the choreographers of Ras Phuhar, appointed for the annual day event of the college. We did not find any student with high or low blood pressure nor may of the students were found to have low or high blood sugar.

Among 3 women for whom blood sample have been collected for Hba1c and TSH test, 2 are teaching staff and one is from college canteen.


