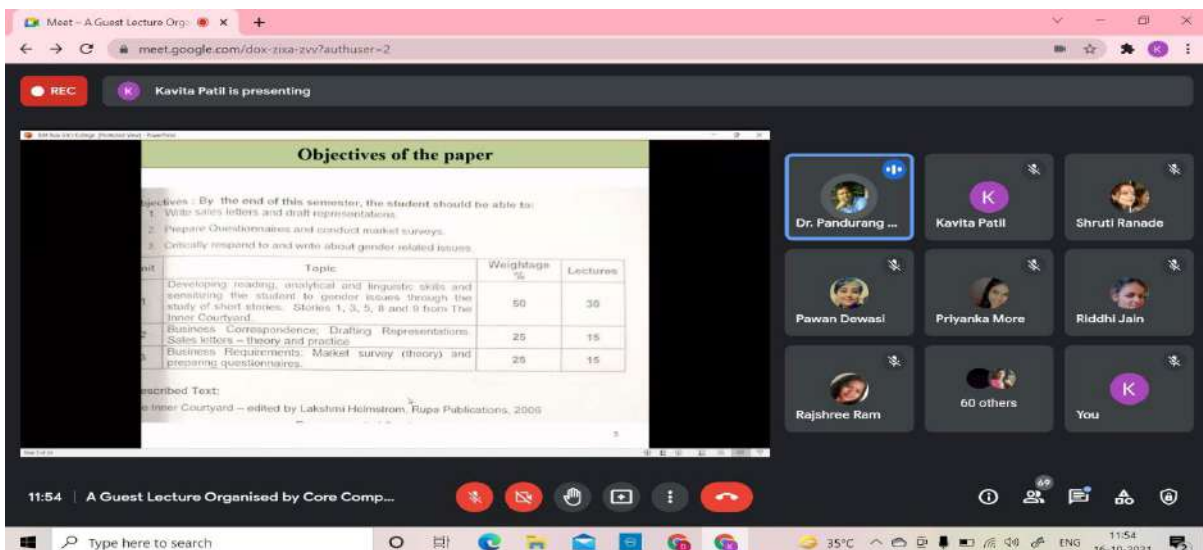

Feminism
 Feminism is an interdisciplinary approach to issues of equality and equity based on gender, gender expression, gender identity, sex, and sexuality as understood through social theories and political activism

The feminist movement
 The feminist movement refers to a series of Social movements and Political campaigns for reforms on women's issues created by the inequality between men and women. Such issues are women's liberation, reproductive rights, domestic violence, maternity leave, equal pay, women's suffrage, sexual harassment, and sexual violence.

Feminism has to serve the interests of all those it relies on to sustain it or it risks becoming a movement with no purpose for most, and an outright weapon against those it claims to represent.

Limitation of Mainstream Feminism

- Cultural factors such as gender, class, race, sexual orientation, physical ability and ethnicity influence the forms of and degree to which different women experience oppression.
- Mainstream feminism has sidelined and silenced many women in its tenure; women of color, lesbians, low-income women, trans women etc.

direct speech (exact words)	reported speech (my words)
He said: "I love you."	He said that he loved me.

EnglishClub TIP

Reported speech is not really difficult. It is more a matter of logic and common sense. You probably have the same concept in your own language, where you use your own words to say what somebody has said or written.

In this lesson we learn about the structure that we use when another person has said, and rules.

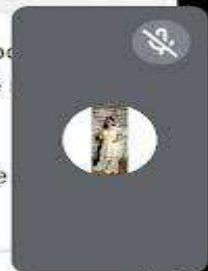
We usually introduce reported statements with "reporting verbs" such as "say" or "tell":

- He **said** (that)...
- He **told** me (that)...

EnglishClub TIP
 When we report a statement, we can say "He said **that**..." or simply "He said...". Both are possible. "He said that..." is more formal.

When we use our own words to report there are one or two things that we change:

- **pronouns** may need to change different perspective
